## DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: 2017-2018 B.A. Degrees

For a more detailed enumeration of all academic requirements and regulations for the Bachelor's Degree, see the 2015-2016 *Undergraduate Bulletin*.

- 1 Correct number of hours presented for degree.
- 2 Forty-five (45) junior/senior hours after the completion of 30 semester hours.
- 3 Completed or enrolled in all required/elective courses.
- 4 Completed the following courses with a grade of C or better:  
**ENG 1003, Composition I; ENG 1013, Composition II; MATH 1023, College Algebra**
- 5 Completed HIST 2763 or 2773, U.S. History or POSC 2103, U.S. Government.
- 6 At least 2.00 grade point average overall (including transfer and ASU work) and at least 2.00 GPA at ASU.
- 7 Minimum grade point average of at least 2.00 calculated on the last grade for each course in the major.
- 8 Other requirements:
  - a. 32 ASU residence hours.
  - b. 18 of last 24 hours, ASU-Jonesboro.
  - c. Credit by correspondence, exam (including CLEP), evaluated military service, and USAFI not to exceed 25%. A maximum of 30 semester hours can be earned by examination.
  - d. Double Major (Optional) all coursework and GPA requirements met. Students may have a double major, but work for both majors must be completed at the time. Work completed after the awarding of 1st bachelors degree may be applied to a 2nd bachelors degree.
  - e. Second Degree, students must meet the degree requirements under the provisions of the catalog in effect at the time the second degree is awarded. If the first degree was awarded by ASU, the student must only complete the remaining degree requirements in residence. If the first degree was not awarded by ASU, the student must complete a minimum of 32 hours in residence at ASU and meet requirements of the degree sought.
- 9 Fill out an online "Application/Intent to Graduate Form," when registering for the final enrollment period. (If the student is unable to graduate at the end of the term for which application has been made, a new form must be submitted during the next term in which the student expects to graduate.)
- 10 Students must complete graduation requirements under the provisions of an ASU-Jonesboro catalog that is not more than seven years old at the time of the student's graduation, provided the student was enrolled in residence at a regionally accredited institution of higher education during the year the catalog was in effect. The 2015-2016 degree plan expires with the August Commencement in 2024.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT: Contact Department of World Languages for further details.

Students must demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language. This may be done in the following ways.

- 1 By completing the second semester of the intermediate year of foreign language at the college level. Students with no foreign language experience must enroll in the first semester of the elementary year and complete 12 hours of a single language. Students with some experience and proficiency should consult with a member of the language faculty about their readiness for more advanced courses.  
(No credit will be awarded for courses waived.)
- 2 By passing an examination acceptable to the foreign language faculty as proof of proficiency equivalent to completion of the second semester of the intermediate year of a foreign language at the college level.
